Directors' Responsibilities and Approval

Accounting Policies

1. Presentation of Annual Financial Statements

The annual financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies as set out below. The annual financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for certain financial instruments at fair value. They are presented in South African Rands.

These accounting policies are consistent with the previous period.

Ikamya Lisezandleni Zethu is a voluntary association operating as a non-profit organisation.

1.1 Taxation

Tax exemption

The association was approved as a public benefit organisation in terms of section 30 of the Income Tax Act (the Act), and the receipts and accruals are exempt from income taxes in terms of section 10(1)(cN) of the Act.

The public benefit organisation was approved for purposes of section 18A(1)(a) of the Act and donations to the organisation will be tax deductible in the hands of the donors in terms of and subject to the limitations prescribed in section 18A of the Act.

1.2 Leases

A lease is classified as a finance lease if it transfers substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. A lease is classified as an operating lease if it does not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership.

Operating leases - lessee

Operating lease payments are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term. The difference between the amounts recognised as an expense and the contractual payments are recognised as an operating lease asset. This liability is not discounted.

1.3 Revenue

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and represents the amounts receivable in the ordinary course of the organisation's activities.

The organisation recognises revenue when:

- the amount of revenue can be reliably measured;
- it is probable that future economic benefits will flow to the entity; and
- specific criteria have been met for the organisation's activities, as described below.

Grant and donations

Grants are recognised in accordance with the provisions of the underlying agreements, and where more appropriate, in the year the expenditure in respect of which the grant was received was incurred.

Donations are recognised as income when received.

Interest income

Interest is recognised, in profit or loss, using the effective interest rate method.

1.4 Equipment

Items of equipment consist of teaching aids in the form of computer equipment, furniture, fixtures and office equipment. These items have a limited useful lives and resale values and are charged to the income statement on acquisition.

Accounting Policies

1.5 Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are recognised initially at the transaction value. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less provision for impairment. A provision for impairment of other receivables are established when there are objective evidence that the organisation will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivable.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, demand deposits and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less. Bank overdrafts are shown within the borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

1.7 Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.
