TRAINING COURSE: BASIC TUTORING	
US Title:	Non-accredited
TRAINING OUTCOMES	

This non-accredited one-day workshop seeks to support afterschool programme practitioners to deliver effective tutoring of grades 9-12 learners. It is based on the IkamvaYouth Tutoring Model that is designed for learners to pass matric and to further their tertiary studies or find post-matric opportunities. However, it could also be adapted to any school grades. This training workshop can be condensed to a less interactive and participatory half-day session for advanced tutors, but it is not the preferred option.

More specifically, after completion of the course, delegates will be able to:

- Provide a theoretical and practical introduction to the tutoring methodology, its characteristics as well as the differences between tutoring and teaching;
- Introduce the theory of peer-to-peer learning and provide practical techniques to facilitate group tutoring sessions;
- Enable your employees to understand learners' motivation and to introduce strategies to maintain attendance by the learners during the course of the tutoring programme; and
- Explore ways to deal with learners' psycho-social and learning difficulties to better manage group dynamics and create a participative learning environment, and to improve discipline and classroom management.

ASSESSMENT

There is no assessment after the training, but it is possible to arrange for summative assessment.

Who should apply?

Applicants must be:

- ❖ In possession of a grade 12, or equivalent qualification;
- Committed to attend all the training days and be fully committed to participate in the process;
- ❖ Having some experience in the After School, Child and Youth Development, or Education sectors and currently working with school learners as their primary beneficiaries; and
- Willing to use the skills and knowledge to support learners in under-resourced communities.

Course costs

The cost of this course is valued at R2,000.00, but we offer scholarships to needy applicants who are providing academic and career support to learners, especially for grades 9-12 learners.
