IkamvaYouth was founded in 2003 by Joy Olivier and Makhosi Gogwana, who after meeting as researchers at the HSRC realised that many of the obstacles learners face are due to lack of information and support. As information and support can be given free of charge, and the principal at Makhosi's old high school was receptive; Makhosi, Joy and their friends began volunteering as tutors and mentors, with a desire to support learners to reach their fullest potential.

Twenty-one years later and IkamvaYouth has grown from strength to strength. IkamvaYouth provides a safe space for learners to be after school, where they receive support with their homework, exam and test preparation and much much more. Our youth driven, low-cost, high impact programmes are learner-led with volunteer tutors facilitating peer-to-peer learning. IkamvaYouth also hosts a Winter School Programme at every branch as well as Matric Week specifically aimed at Matric support. In addition to the academic support provided at IkamvaYouth, we ensure that learners receive career guidance and are assisted with post-school placement to prepare learners for the world beyond school.

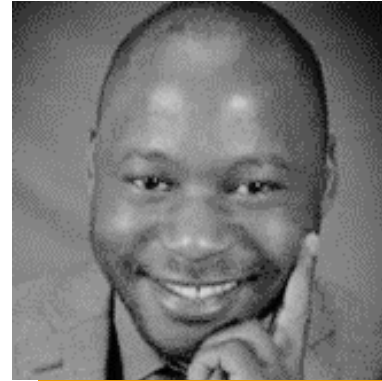

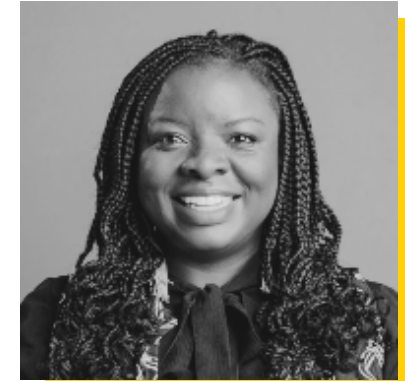

2024 was a momentous year for IkamvaYouth as we celebrated our 21st anniversary. This milestone is a testament to our passion and the dedication of our board, staff, volunteers, learners, donors, and partners who have consistently championed the cause of educational access and success for our youth.

At our 15 branches across the country, we supported 4,022 learners, providing them with the academic, social, and emotional support they need to thrive. The IkamvaYouth class of 2024 achieved a remarkable 93% pass rate in the National Senior Certificate examinations, a resounding victory against the odds in a challenging educational landscape. We are immensely proud of them!

Beyond simply passing matric, we prioritised quality passes that open doors to higher education. We are immensely proud that 63% of our learners achieved a bachelor's pass, and 22% achieved a diploma pass, resulting in an impressive 85% tertiary eligibility pass rate. Our dedicated branch staff and volunteers will continue to provide unwavering support to ensure a smooth transition for our learners into their chosen paths of study and future careers. Furthermore, our Skills Development programme empowered mighty young people with valuable vocational training and

workplace readiness skills, equipping them with the tools they need to secure meaningful employment. We are deeply grateful to The Bank of America for your support in running this programme. More about how we are addressing the NEETs crisis on page 33.

CEO Letter

2024 was a year of significant growth and impact for IkamvaYouth as we celebrated our 21st anniversary. This milestone underscores the enduring power of our mission to provide quality education and support to South Africa's youth. We remain committed to our vision of a world where young people have the opportunity to create sustainable livelihoods.

At the heart of our success lies the dedication and resilience of our learners, the support of our staff, Board members (past and present) and volunteers, and the invaluable partnerships we have forged with our donors and stakeholders. Thank you all. A special mention needs to go out to Joy Olivier and Makhosi Gogwana who established IkamvaYouth 21 years ago. From a bold idea to make a difference, an organisation with 15 branches in multiple provinces across South Africa was born and continues to leave an indelible mark on the education and youth development landscape in South Africa.

This year, we supported 4,022 learners nationally across our 15 branches, providing them with the quality support they need to achieve their potential. The IkamvaYouth **Matric Class of 2024 achieved a remarkable 93% pass rate**, a testament to the effectiveness of our programme and the hard work of our learners. We are particularly proud that 85% of our learners achieved either a bachelor's pass or a diploma pass, ensuring their eligibility for higher education. This success reflects our commitment to quality education and our focus on preparing our learners for future success.

We are continuously exploring innovative ways to enhance our programmes and better serve our learners. I would like to thank each and every one of our partners who supported us through shared learnings, workshops and training, enriching our programmes for our learners.

As we move forward, IkamvaYouth will continue to prioritise innovation, adapt to the evolving needs of our learners, and cultivate strategic partnerships to maximise our impact. 2024 saw us embarking on these sorts of impactful partnerships. We partnered with Absa as their implementing partner for the Absa Consumer Education Training programme in the Eastern Cape, equipping young people with essential financial literacy skills. We also partnered with the GIBS Spirit of Youth Programme which supported 160 learners with leadership development. Both of these programmes were a great success, to learn more about them please see pages 37, 40 and 44.

Furthermore, our passion for strengthening the After-School Sector continues to grow. Through our Community Collaboration Programme, we partnered with 18 organisations, leveraging the power of the IkamvaYouth model to support an additional 5,000+ learners. This collaborative approach demonstrates the transformative impact that can be achieved through collective action.

Financially, 2024 presented significant challenges. The conclusion of the hugely successful Shell programme led to an unexpected revenue drop of R5 million, a gap that proved difficult to fill despite our best efforts to recalibrate our budget and operations as well as sourcing new revenue streams. These experiences underscore the importance of sustainability, adaptability, and resilience in a challenging economic climate. We remain deeply grateful to Shell for their partnership over the past five years, which supported nearly 5,000 rural learners across 25 schools in four provinces.

As we move forward, we will continue to seek innovative solutions, adapt to the evolving needs of our learners, and strengthen our partnerships to ensure that IkamvaYouth remains a beacon of hope and opportunity for young people around the country.

The Award-winning IkamvaYouth Model

The power of the IkamvaYouth model

IkamvaYouth is a leading South African non-profit organisation. We are dedicated to improving access to quality education for young people from under-resourced communities. Through a multifaceted approach, we provide comprehensive support to youth, enabling them to achieve academic success, explore their career aspirations, and build a strong foundation for their future.

After-school tutoring programme:

At the heart of IkamvaYouth lies our Core Tutoring Programme. This programme offers free, high-quality after-school tutoring to high school learners in a supportive and peer-to-peer environment. Our network of 15 branches, strategically located across Gauteng, the Western Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, the Eastern Cape, and the North West Province, directly assisted 4,022 learners in 2024, with 421 tutors providing invaluable guidance. Notably, 64% of our beneficiaries are girls, emphasising our commitment to gender equity. This programme, facilitated by volunteer tutors from the same communities as the learners, focuses on academic support, building confidence, and fostering a love for learning.

Enriching Programmes:

Beyond our core tutoring, at IkamvaYouth we offer a range of enriching programmes designed to holistically support learner development. Our annual Winter School provides intensive tutoring during the school holidays, ensuring continued learning and academic progress. Matric Week, a dedicated component of Winter School, focuses on assisting matric learners with their studies and guiding them through the post-school application process.

Furthermore, we partner with various organisations to offer a comprehensive suite of support services, including:

- **Grade 11 Matric Readiness Workshops:** Preparing learners for the challenges of the final year of high school.
- **Educational and Career-Focused Excursions:** Broadening learners horizons and exposing learners to diverse career paths.
- **Life Skills Workshops:** Addressing critical issues such as mental health, sexual health, and gender-based violence.
- **Computer Literacy and Skills Development Workshops:** Equipping learners with essential digital and employability skills.
- **Entrepreneurship Workshops:** Cultivating entrepreneurial spirit and fostering self-reliance.
- **Career Guidance Assessments:** Assisting learners in exploring their career interests and making informed educational and career choices.

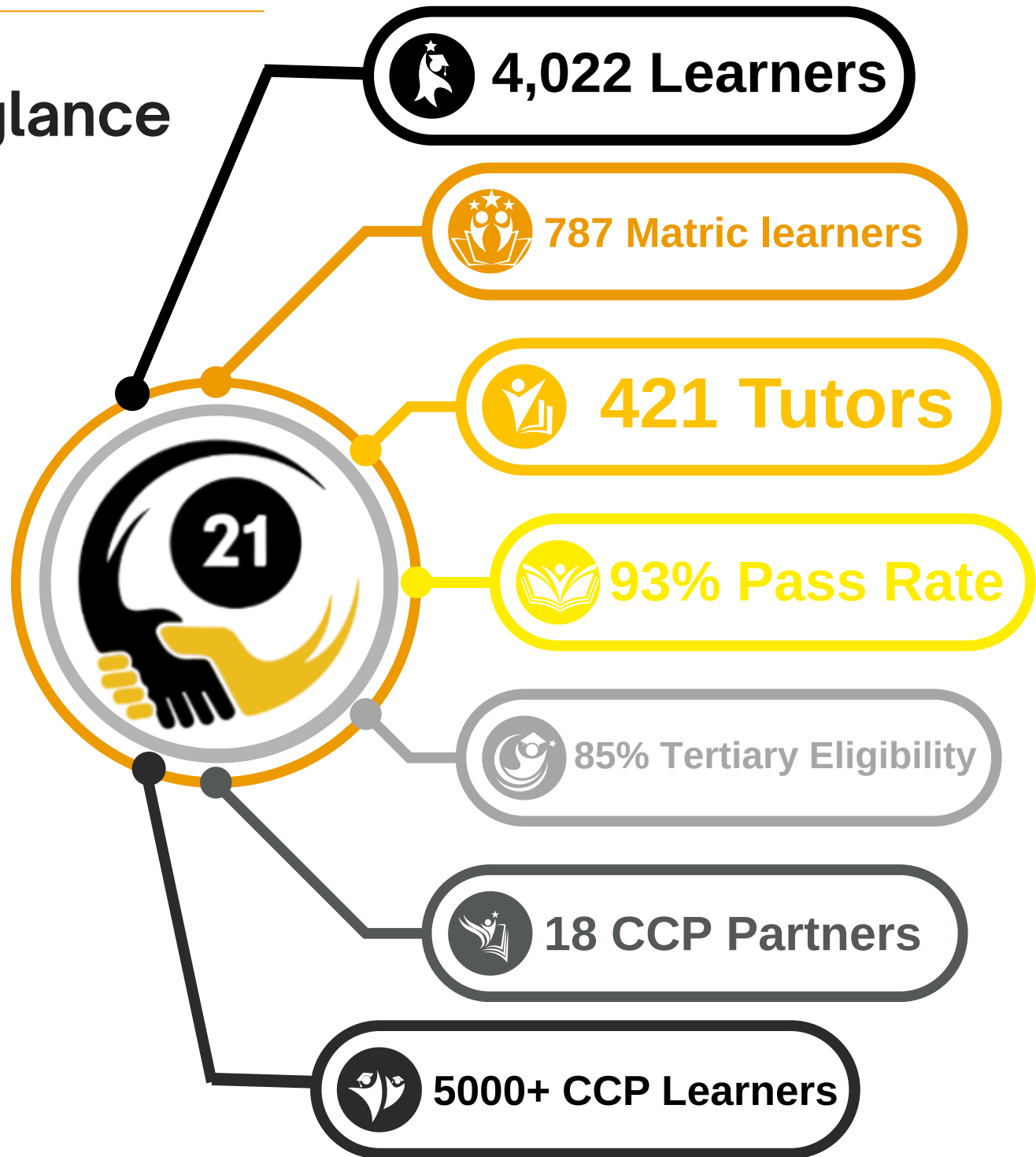

Maths and Science Results



IkamvaYouth plays a key role in redressing inequality by enabling more learners to pass Mathematics and Science. Mathematics and science results are key not only to economic growth but for sustainability more broadly.

Learners who enroll in IkamvaYouth's programmes are much more likely to select Mathematics and Physical Science than their counterparts. At a quarter of IkamvaYouth's partner schools, more than 50% of learners did not pass Mathematics.

294 IkamvaYouth Learners wrote Mathematics and 242 Learners wrote Science. The Mathematics pass rate was 67%, and the Science pass rate was 66%. Less than 18% achieved over 50% for Mathematics in Quintile 1-3 schools whereas 37% of learners enrolled in the IkamvaYouth programme achieved over 50% for Mathematics.



My name is Lindile Shasha, and I would like to share how IkamvaYouth has positively impacted my life. I joined the programme in 2022 while in Grade 11, and at the time, I struggled with subjects like Maths and Physics. However, after joining the programme, my marks improved significantly. Even after completing my matric in 2023, I didn't initially secure a place at a tertiary institution. Despite this setback, I became a tutor within the programme while reapplying for studies. Today, I am proud to say that I am now a first-year student at the Cape Peninsula University of Technology, pursuing a Diploma in Nature Conservation. I am truly grateful for the support I received from IkamvaYouth. The programme has been instrumental in helping me achieve my goals, and I truly appreciate the assistance I received.

The Eastern Cape and KwaZulu Natal

In 2024, IkamvaYouth celebrated a remarkable milestone—21 years of empowering the youth through education. This coming-of-age moment reaffirmed our position as a leader in youth development, driving us to enhance the quality of our programmes and strengthen stakeholder relationships. Our goal was clear: to maximise our impact, ensuring that our work not only transforms the lives of our learners but also uplifts the communities we serve.

The KwaZulu-Natal and Eastern Cape region achieved outstanding results. The Class of 2024 attained an impressive 91% overall pass rate, with 86% of learners qualifying for tertiary education. These achievements underscore the effectiveness of the IkamvaYouth model, demonstrating the power of commitment and strategic intervention.

Among our standout successes, the Chesterville branch emerged as the top-performing branch in the region, achieving a remarkable 97% pass rate. Even more impressively, 97% of its learners qualified for tertiary education, with 87% securing coveted Bachelor passes with an 18% increase from the previous year. This growth reflects the branch's dedication to academic excellence and continuous improvement.

A true testament to this success is Bongani, the branch's top learner, who earned an astounding six distinctions. Here's what he had to say about his journey:

To enhance visibility and strengthen community engagement, our branches organised a series of impactful programmes that brought together key stakeholders and raised awareness about our work. Among these was the vibrant Joza Colour Festival, featuring a fun-filled colour walk and sports day. This event not only showcased our initiatives to the community but also served as a fundraising opportunity to support our mission. Similarly, our KwaZulu-Natal branches hosted a Spring Fun Walk & Market Day, fostering connections among various stakeholders while promoting our programmes.

Additionally, the Joza branch actively contributed to the Makhanda Education Summit, hosted by Rhodes University. This gathering of organisations and government representatives aimed to reimagine the local education landscape, ensuring that more young people in Makhanda have access to the skills, resources, and opportunities necessary for academic success.

Meanwhile, our KwaZulu-Natal branches, as part of the Cato Manor Community of Practice, participated in the first-ever Community Expo, a groundbreaking initiative designed to connect local youth with organisations and opportunities that can propel them toward success. The event featured Master Classes, exhibitions, and interactive sessions, providing young people with valuable insights and pathways for growth.



In 2024, the Joza branch also took a significant step forward in STEM education by introducing robotics and coding classes for Grade 9 learners in partnership with Awarenet, joining the already-running Robotics Club that was initiated in KZN in the year 2023. This initiative helps instil a passion for technology and innovation at an early age, equipping learners with essential skills for the future.

Our commitment to holistic youth development also extends to addressing social issues. Boys from our Chesterville and Umlazi branches took part in the nationwide "What About The Boys" initiative, joining hundreds of schools in a two-week programme focused on tackling gender-based violence (GBV). The initiative explored crucial topics such as constructive

2024 holds a memoir of the most inspiring stories! As we mark 21 years of empowering young minds, the Gauteng and North West district has made history by achieving the highest matric pass rate in a decade, an outstanding 94%!

The years successes are due to our holistic approach to our programme that combines life skills, career guidance, mentorship, leadership, and academic support. The region achieved 80% Bachelor’s and Diploma passes, an 8% increase from 2023’s 72%. Learners in the Gauteng and North West branches earned a total of 153 distinctions, showcasing academic excellence across the school subjects as Mathematics, Science, Geography among others.

We remain committed to placing all 2024 matric learners in post-matric institutions. This includes tertiary education, learnerships, employment, skills training, fellowships, and supplementary or upgrading programmes. Each learner from our 2024 cohort has applied to a minimum of three placement opportunities, ensuring a **strong foundation for their future endeavours.**

In 2024, IkamvaYouth proudly celebrated 21 years of impactful existence. The Western Cape (WC) team commemorated this milestone with a regional celebration at the Gugulethu Branch, within Gugulethu Comprehensive High School. This event united co-founder Joy Olivier, parents, volunteers, learners, and partners in a heartfelt occasion that honoured the organisation's journey and the collective commitment of all stakeholders.

The Western Cape region achieved an impressive 93% matric pass rate for the class of 2024, with 86% of learners qualifying for tertiary education. This remarkable achievement positions the WC region as the top-performing province within IkamvaYouth nationally. Over 94% of our matriculants have secured placements in tertiary institutions, learnerships, or skills development programmes, reflecting the extraordinary potential of our learners.

In alignment with our mission to increase access to post-school opportunities, the Western Cape region successfully led a Tertiary Application Drive. Implemented on Youth Day, Mandela Day, and Heritage Day, this initiative targeted high-impact engagement with schools such as Ocean View Secondary (Ocean View), Kayamandi Secondary (Stellenbosch), and Proteus High School (Atlantis), ensuring that more learners received guidance and support with their tertiary applications.

These achievements are more than just statistics; when a learner succeeds, a family benefits. In turn, a community is uplifted, and society as a whole progresses.

Skills Development Programme

Skills Development Programme

In response to the escalating unemployment rates among youth and the pressing demand for skills development in South Africa, IkamvaYouth initiated a focused Skills Development Programme designed to equip young individuals with practical, marketable skills that significantly improve their employability prospects. In 2024, IkamvaYouth successfully launched a comprehensive training initiative to address critical gaps in youth employment. This programme provided structured training for 90 unemployed youths, offering them essential skills in various high-demand sectors. The courses were meticulously designed to cover a range of competencies, including:

- Cybersecurity
- Software Development
- Electrical Aide
- Welding Aide
- Facilitator, Moderator, and Assessor Course
- Appliance Repairs and Entrepreneurship

The training programme blended theoretical knowledge with hands-on experience, ensuring that participants acquired practical skills relevant to multiple employment sectors.

The programme has recorded considerable success over the past three years. Out of the 90 youth who completed the training, 36 participants (40%) successfully secured paid

learnerships, internships, or full-time employment in their respective fields. The remaining participants benefit from continued mentorship, job-readiness support, and access to employment networks through IkamvaYouth and its partners.

The Skills Development Programme has demonstrated strong potential to positively impact the lives of young people by enhancing their employability and economic opportunities. IkamvaYouth is dedicated to expanding this initiative, building stronger partnerships within the industry, and providing ongoing support to help the remaining participants achieve successful career outcomes.



Special Projects



Consumer Financial Education Programme

From March to July 2024, IkamvaYouth, in partnership with Absa, successfully implemented the Consumer Financial Education Programme, equipping over 2,000 young South Africans (aged 16-35) with critical financial literacy skills and an in-depth understanding of consumer rights and responsibilities. By targeting vulnerable groups, particularly low-income earners and students, the program empowered participants to make informed financial decisions, safeguard their consumer rights, and contribute to the financial well-being of their communities.

The programme delivered measurable, tangible improvements in financial knowledge, confidence, and behaviours. Participants reported a heightened ability to manage personal finances, recognise and avoid financial scams, and assert their consumer rights effectively. The substantial knowledge gains and overwhelmingly positive feedback underscore the programme's success in fostering long-term financial stability and resilience.

Key Programme Highlights

Interactive Workshops: A total of 51 face-to-face workshops were conducted by our Joza Branch team, utilizing practical, real-life examples to make financial literacy and consumer rights relatable and applicable.

Rural Reach & Accessibility: The program achieved an impressive 100% rural participation rate, exceeding expectations and ensuring access to financial education for underserved communities.

Diversity & Inclusion: The participant group reflected a diverse demographic, with a gender split of 58% female and broad ethnic representation, reinforcing our commitment to inclusivity.

Financial Inclusion: Over 50% of participants were unbanked at the start of the program, highlighting a critical gap in financial access and underscoring the importance of targeted interventions.

Knowledge & Skills Development: Participants demonstrated an 18% improvement in financial literacy and consumer rights knowledge, validating the effectiveness of the training. Additionally, 89% of participants expressed high satisfaction with the content, appreciating its relevance and applicability.

The Consumer Financial Education Programme successfully met all its milestones and was executed in full compliance with the required standards for measuring consumer education within the framework of Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE). Beyond financial literacy, participants gained a deeper understanding of the legal frameworks and best practices governing consumer transactions, equipping them to assert their rights, challenge exploitative practices, and effectively navigate financial disputes.

By fostering a financially empowered and informed youth population, this initiative contributes to broader economic resilience and sustainable community development. The impact of this programme will extend far beyond its duration, as participants apply their knowledge, share insights within their communities, and champion financial inclusion for all.



Spirit of Youth Programme

In 2024, IkamvaYouth partnered with the Gordon Institute of Business Science (GIBS) to deliver the revised Spirit of Youth Programme, equipping 160 Grade 11 learners with leadership skills to navigate complex societal challenges. Rooted in an Afro-positivist framework, the programme empowered young leaders to become changemakers within their communities and beyond.

Originally launched in 2005 under the leadership of former Reserve Bank Governor Gill Marcus, the Spirit of Youth Programme has been instrumental in shaping young minds. The 2024 programme continued this legacy, bringing together learners from Gauteng and the Western Cape, including IkamvaYouth Grade 11 learners from selected branches. These learners had the unique opportunity to participate in discussions, develop critical skills, and champion innovative solutions that address Africa's socio-economic challenges.

A significant focus of the programme aligned with key United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), ensuring that learners not only built leadership skills but also engaged with global priorities:

- Quality Education (SDG 4): fostering knowledge, leadership, and problem-solving skills.
- Reduced Inequalities (SDG 10): uniting diverse youth to promote inclusion and understanding.

Shell STEM Programme

Since 2020, Shell Downstream SA and IkamvaYouth have partnered to address STEM education barriers in under-resourced rural communities. By 2024, the initiative increased pass rates in Mathematics and Physical Science, equipped teachers with new skills, and sparked learner-led tutoring models. This year marked a pivotal milestone: the successful transfer of capabilities to schools and communities, ensuring the programme's sustainability without direct IkamvaYouth oversight.

In 2024, the project entered a new and vital phase of capability transfer to empower schools and local stakeholders to sustain and expand the programme without on-the-ground support from IkamvaYouth staff. The process has proven highly successful, reinforcing the importance of local ownership and long-term sustainability in educational interventions.

The intervention directly responded to the educational gaps in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) subjects in rural areas. Key achievements include:

- **Increased STEM Subject Pass Rates.**
- **Enhance Learner Engagement.**
- **Exposure to Practical Applications.**

Shell STEM Programme

The Shell STEM Programme also had a significant impact on teacher development. Teacher capacity was bolstered through targeted training, mentorship, and resource sharing. As a result:

- Teachers reported increased confidence and competence in delivering STEM subjects.
- Innovative, learner-centered teaching methodologies were adopted.
- Peer-to-peer support systems among teachers emerged organically, fostering ongoing professional growth.
- Expert tutors worked alongside educators, modelling high-impact tutoring and creating inspiring, learner-centered environments.

This has laid the foundation for more resilient and adaptive teaching practices that will endure beyond the lifespan of the intervention.



Capability Transfer: Enabling Community Ownership

In 2024, the project transitioned to a capability transfer phase, where schools and community organisations assumed full responsibility for programme implementation.

This strategic shift included:

- Stakeholder Engagement Workshops led by Shell, aligning school leadership, school governing bodies, and parents.
- Teacher Awards by Shell served as an acknowledgement of the great work the teachers are doing, a confirmation that the intervention had moved teachers to a better level with some learners now achieving 70% pass rate for Physical Science, yet before the intervention, they were at 17%.
- STEM Bursary Activation in all provinces, enabling learners to transition into tertiary STEM fields, by receiving the first priority to apply for the all costs covered Shell bursary.

The STEM intervention has delivered measurable academic improvements and long-term capacity within both learners and teachers. By concluding with a structured capability transfer, the programme ensures sustainability and deeper integration into community education systems.

This scale of investment holds the potential to substantially impact socio-economic transformation in the country but for many corporations it has defaulted to an exercise of B-BBEE compliance. Investing your B-BBEE spend in IkamvaYouth represents an opportunity to achieve lasting impact and unlock transformative potential.

Ownership

Social Economic Development (SED)

Skills Development Points

There are currently three ways in which IkamvaYouth and your company could partner under this pillar: i) Training; ii) Interns/Learnerships and iii) matric bursary programme.

Training

IkamvaYouth needs to invest in training for its managers and staff. This includes some Senior Management, Middle Management and Junior Management as well as junior staff members.

Interns/Learnership

IkamvaYouth will be hiring interns to support our branches. By funding this programme your company can earn points under Skills Development. Some of these interns may be absorbed into IkamvaYouth or other organisations doing similar work as Branch Assistants at the end of the internship but it will depend on what positions are available in the organisation/s at the time and, of course, how they perform during the year. If that happens then your company could also earn bonus points even if they aren't absorbed into your company. This programme could also be positioned under the YES initiative and enable you to increase your B-BBEE level through bonus points.

Matric Bursary Programme

IkamvaYouth's matric bursary programme has been verified by Grant Thornton so you can be sure to earn points under Category A for Skills Development. Each matric learner is a black South African, the matric course is an accredited course so you can get full points under category A.
